

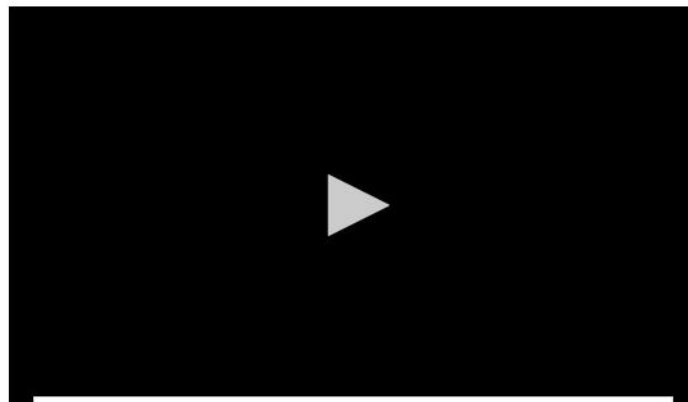

Automatic Check-ins

Share docs, files, images, and spreadsheets. Organize in folders so they're easy to find.
